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Parlour’s work is supported by tax-deductible donations from Parlour Friends, and by sponsorship from our Parlour Partners.

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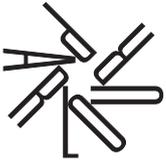
Donors are all acknowledged on our **online list of Parlour Friends**, and each receives a Parlour Friend marque denoting their donor category.
